#### 1. REVIEW / APPROVAL OF MAY MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 2:23pm. The minutes of the previous meeting were emailed to the committee for review. A motion to accept the minutes was made by Hania and seconded by Monica minutes approved.

2. **VOTING CHAIR POSITIONS AVAILBLE** - Nominations were made for the available positions of SAC Chair, SAF Chair and i-Zone Representative. Mrs. Iser nominated Michele Laudanno for SAC Chair, the nomination was accepted. A vote was taken by a show of hands; there was unanimous consensus for Michele Laudanno for SAC Chair. Mrs. Freeman nominated Corey Fleming for SAF Chair, and the nomination was accepted. A vote was taken by a show of hands; there was unanimous consensus for Corey Fleming for SAF Chair. #### 4. PRINCIPAL UPDATE - deZayas

##### a. B.O.Y testing (Beginning of Year)

Ms. de Zayas explained to the committee the importance of the SAC Committee and how the Committee sets the blueprint for the school including goals, budget and working towards meeting those goals. Historical data was shared back to 2020. The data was reviewed; school grade ranking compared to the district ranking. We are doing phenomenally but there is always room for growth. We were #9 in the district in Math learning gains, this is the data that will drive our instructional plan, this is where we need to work on. How do we balance the learning gains scale? Well, we have implemented a specials schedule for 4<sup>th</sup> grade teachers, the teachers have team planning time to plan together. Leading data was shared with PM1 - ELA & math - compared to last year's PM1, PM2 data will be shared before the holidays.

I-ready leading data was shared. I-ready is personalized and scaffolds the students based on their performance. Students are not only completing but also passing the modules. There will not be an i-ready diagnostic this year, they used last year's end of year data to personalize the pathways. Teachers are to either remediate or accelerate based on the students' needs.

b. **Science Lab** - We are excited to share that we have a brand-new science lab. A parent donor donated \$6k and our PTA matched the donation. Our 3d grade classes went thru the science lab today.

We also have a brand-new mural for the science lab hallway donated by Camp Wannado; thank you Camp Wannado for your support.

1. **CALL TO ORDER / INTRODUCTIONS**

The meeting was called to order at 2:21pm. All committee members in attendance were welcomed and thanked for their time.
2. **REVIEW / APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING'S MINUTES**

The minutes were sent via email to the committee members for review. Minutes approved.
3. **SCHOOL ENVIRONMENTAL SAFETY INCIDENT REPORTING (SESIR)**

During every SAC meeting we will make the committee aware of any safety and security incidents that have been reported. There are no SESIR incidents to report.
4. **ACCOUNTABILITY FUNDS**

The amount of Accountability funds is not currently available. Funds have not yet rolled over into the budget from last school year. There was a discussion on the use of these funds when they become available. Mrs. Laudanno explained that in the past the committee voted and approved the use of these funds to pay the teachers for after-school academic camps. A motion was made by Mrs. Iser to allow the use of up to \$10,000 of accountability funds for the after-school academic camps; Mrs. Catania seconded that motion. There was a discussion about how beneficial the camps have been in past in improving student performance. A vote was taken, 18 committee members raised their hands in favor of using up to \$10,000 to fund after-school academic camps to pay the teachers, none were opposed. Motion passed unanimously.
5. **SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN MONITORING AND STAKEHOLDER FEEDBACK (SIP)**

-PM1 data and i-Ready D1 data were shared at the last SAC meeting. We will have updated data for our next meeting PM2 (Math Dec. 4 and Reading Dec. 9) i-Ready D2 will take place in January when we return from the winter break. The data will be analyzed and used to drive the instruction.
6. **PRESENTATIONS**
  - A. **PRINCIPAL UPDATE -**

Mrs. de Zayas was not available, Ms. Greer provided the Principal's update. Mrs. Greer acknowledged Mrs. Laudanno for a job well done as the SAC Chair.

- Monthly Challenges (top 25 students in each grade level most passed i-Ready reading lessons receive popcorn reward contest ends Friday and new challenge starts November for Reflex in grades 1-5 and Frax in grades 4-5. Teachers will be invited to join. Reflex will track green lights and Frax will track missions completed. Green lights are earned in Reflex when a child answers a certain number of questions correctly in a certain amount of time. Science challenge will also be developed for Progress learning.
- Boosterthon Earnings \$39,000 used for the renovation of the media center
- Parenting Corner-Representatives of the mental health department came to EPE to give parenting classes on how to utilize strategies from everything to getting homework completed, getting your child up out of bed and ready for school on time. Parents gave lots of positive feedback. Classes were delivered in both Spanish and English to parents. Most popular topics will be discussed in a future seminar for parents.

## **B. EPE SPOTLIGHT**

Mrs. Costantino, our art teacher, brought the committee up to date with all of the exciting things happening in art class.

- National School Lunch Poster Contest – Students just finished the posters for the National School Lunch Poster Contest. School level winners have been selected and their posters submitted for the district level contest. We are excited about the results.
  - Yearbook cover contest – Yearbook cover contest is coming up soon. All of the grades can participate. 5th grade students get to compete for the cover and inside pages as well.
  - Grade Level Art - PreK, K & 1<sup>st</sup> graders are working with shapes, creating a collage. 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> graders are working with fall leaves; 4<sup>th</sup> graders are working on Tim Burton style portraits. 5<sup>th</sup> graders are working with clay and ceramics using different techniques.

- Education Legislation:
  - o HB 1255: Revises provisions relating to critical teacher shortage areas, Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children, Florida School for Competitive Academics, use of certain educational funds, emergency opioid antagonists, corporal punishment, background screening requirements for private schools, prekindergarten programs, students of military families, K-12 courses, instruction, standards, & benchmarks, New Worlds Tutoring Program, & educator certifications.





# GRADE LEVEL ALIGNMENT OF WIG'S

## 25-26 PLC GOALS

- By May 2026, all **Kindergarten** students will score a minimum of 90% on the 3<sup>rd</sup> administration of the phonological awareness screener. **Baseline:** 31% proficient in phonological awareness. **By mid-year goal:** 50% percent of students will be proficient in phonological awareness.
- By May 2026, 90% of all **1<sup>st</sup> grade** students will score late-1<sup>st</sup> grade level or higher in their phonics domain as measured by their i-Ready Reading Diagnostic 3. **Baseline:** 34% proficiency in phonics. **By mid-year** 50% of students will be proficient in phonics.
- By May 2026, 100% of all **2<sup>nd</sup> grade** students will be on grade level in Phonics as measured by Diagnostic 3. **Baseline data:** 48% proficient in phonics. **By mid-year,** 75% of students will be proficient in phonics.
- By May 2026, the percentage of **3<sup>rd</sup> grade** students scoring a Level 3+ will increase from 52% (PM1) to 95% as measured by the ELA FAST PM 3.
- By May 2026, 90% of **4<sup>th</sup> grade** students will achieve a math learning gain as measured by the F.A.S.T Math PM3. Last year, 78% of students achieved a math learning gain.
- By May 2026 90% of **5<sup>th</sup> grade** students will achieve an ELA learning gain as measured by the ELA PM 3 FAST. Last year, 78% of students achieved an ELA learning gain.
