

1. **CALL TO ORDER / INTRODUCTIONS**

The meeting was called to order at 2:21pm. All committee members in attendance were welcomed and thanked for their time.
2. **REVIEW / APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING'S MINUTES**

The minutes were sent via email to the committee members for review. Minutes approved.
3. **SCHOOL ENVIRONMENTAL SAFETY INCIDENT REPORTING (SESIR)**

During every SAC meeting we will make the committee aware of any safety and security incidents that have been reported. There are no SESIR incidents to report.
4. **ACCOUNTABILITY FUNDS**

The amount of Accountability funds is not currently available. Funds have not yet rolled over into the budget from last school year. There was a discussion on the use of these funds when they become available. Mrs. Laudanno explained that in the past the committee voted and approved the use of these funds to pay the teachers for after-school academic camps. A motion was made by Mrs. Iser to allow the use of up to \$10,000 of accountability funds for the after-school academic camps; Mrs. Catania seconded that motion. There was a discussion about how beneficial the camps have been in past in improving student performance. A vote was taken, 18 committee members raised their hands in favor of using up to \$10,000 to fund after-school academic camps to pay the teachers, none were opposed. Motion passed unanimously.
5. **SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN MONITORING AND STAKEHOLDER FEEDBACK (SIP)**

-PM1 data and i-Ready D1 data were shared at the last SAC meeting. We will have updated data for our next meeting PM2 (Math Dec. 4 and Reading Dec. 9) i-Ready D2 will take place in January when we return from the winter break. The data will be analyzed and used to drive the instruction.
6. **PRESENTATIONS**
 - A. **PRINCIPAL UPDATE -**

Mrs. de Zayas was not available, Ms. Greer provided the Principal's update. Mrs. Greer acknowledged Mrs. Laudanno for a job well done as the SAC Chair.

- Monthly Challenges (top 25 students in each grade level most passed i-Ready reading lessons receive popcorn reward contest ends Friday and new challenge starts November for Reflex in grades 1-5 and Frax in grades 4-5. Teachers will be invited to join. Reflex will track green lights and Frax will track missions completed. Green lights are earned in Reflex when a child answers a certain number of questions correctly in a certain amount of time. Science challenge will also be developed for Progress learning.
- Boosterthon Earnings \$39,000 used for the renovation of the media center
- Parenting Corner-Representatives of the mental health department came to EPE to give parenting classes on how to utilize strategies from everything to getting homework completed, getting your child up out of bed and ready for school on time. Parents gave lots of positive feedback. Classes were delivered in both Spanish and English to parents. Most popular topics will be discussed in a future seminar for parents.

B. EPE SPOTLIGHT

Mrs. Costantino, our art teacher, brought the committee up to date with all of the exciting things happening in art class.

- National School Lunch Poster Contest - Students just finished the posters for the National School Lunch Poster Contest. School level winners have been selected and their posters submitted for the district level contest. We are excited about the results.
 - Yearbook cover contest - Yearbook cover contest is coming up soon. All of the grades can participate. 5th grade students get to compete for the cover and inside pages as well.
 - Grade Level Art - PreK, K & 1st graders are working with shapes, creating a collage. 2nd & 3rd graders are working with fall leaves; 4th graders are working on Tim Burton style portraits. 5th graders are working with clay and ceramics using different techniques.
- Mrs. Lomonaco added that the theme for the yearbook this year is "EPE 30 years lets celebrate together".

Mrs. Morales spoke about the recent ESOL Reading Game Night. It was a great success with many families participating.

1. CALL TO ORDER / INTRODUCTIONS

The meeting was called to order at 2:21pm. Out of 24 SAC members, there were 19 members present; quorums have been met for voting.

2. REVIEW / APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING'S MINUTES

The minutes were sent via email to all members for their review. There were no revisions needed, the minutes from the previous meeting were approved.

3. SCHOOL ENVIRONMENTAL SAFETY INCIDENT REPORTING (SESIR)

There were no SESIR incidents to report.

4. ACCOUNTABILITY FUNDS

There is \$2,811.09 in accountability funds. During the last meeting a vote was taken to utilize no more than \$10,000 to pay teachers for academic camps.

5. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN MONITORING AND STAKEHOLDER FEEDBACK (SIP)

-PM2 (mid-year) testing has started. We have begun testing ESE students in small groups. The data is looking good so far. We will have more complete data for the next meeting. ---We have established a student incentive to keep students motivated - Level Up - for students that can move up a level on the FAST. These students will be invited to attend a carnival type of day with games and treats. Our amazing PTA will assist with this. Mrs. Laudanno added that it is a great incentive attainable for all students. The tentative date is December 19th.

-The upcoming employee planning day on January 5th will be a professional development day for teachers, where we will review the data from PM2. We will use this data to target the students for after-school academic camps. We will figure out how to fund the camps as the accountability money is not sufficient to cover.

-We will be having data chats with each grade level to determine areas of support.

6. PRESENTATIONS

A. PRINCIPAL UPDATE

B. EPE SPOTLIGHT

Mr. Wozniak our Debate specials teacher, gave an update on our debate class special and debate club. We are currently one of three elementary schools that offer a debate class. The debate club students attended the first competition of three for this school year. There were 699 students competing; one of our students (out of twenty-two) took home a medal, which is truly amazing! It was a tough category, same as for high school students just modified. The category that she competed in is called "impromptu speaking". The speaker develops their speech in a short amount of time, comes up with their position on the debate and prepares their five-minute speech. There are more competitions coming up, the next one will be in February. Mr. Wozniak went on to say he felt that the Leader In Me program helps students to eventually feel a certain level of comfort speaking publicly. Mr. Wozniak is highly impressed and looks forward to future competitions.

7. NEW BUSINESS

A. A+ Recognition

This year the school will receive A+ Recognition funds in the amount of \$88,502 for bonus payments. A sample ballot from the past school year was shown as an example. There was a brief discussion. Mr. Fleming suggested using some of the future A+ funds towards innovative programs within the school for teachers. A predetermined amount would be set aside; the teacher would complete a grant-style application for approval or denial of funds to be used in their project. Ms. de Zayas remembered that we did something like this in the past that was funded by PTA. The committee proposed the following ballot:

Proposal A - Equal distribution - Funds are distributed equally to all eligible employees, Instructional and Non-Instructional.

Proposal B - 80/20 split - Funds are distributed 80% to instructional staff and 20% to non-instructional employees.

Proposal C - None of the above

To be eligible:

- Instructional employees are teachers, guidance counselors, ESE support team and administration.
- Non-Instructional are office staff, custodial, paraprofessionals, cafeteria staff and campus monitors.
- The employee had to be present for at least 99 school days (where students are present) during the 2024-2025 school year.
- Part time employees will receive 50% of the amount.
- Employees shared with other schools will receive 50% of the amount.

A motion was made by Hania Majzoub to accept the above proposal and seconded by Erin Freeman. The above proposals were voted on; all of the members below were present and voted "yes" to the above proposal:

Barnes & Noble Spanish Book Fair - will be on December 3rd at the Barnes & Nobles in Sunrise.





