- Call to Order and establish quorum – Meeting started at 3:12pm

- Approval of Minutes – Erika Luna motioned to accept the minutes. Mrs. Tammy Schoen seconded.
- Principal's Report – Given by Mr. Wood. You can always follow Dr. Kaplan on Instagram. And be sure to read Kaplan's Korner every Friday.
- PTSO Report – Danielle Tortorella is the new PTSO President. Score at the Top has 13 sign-ups. It starts October 8th and goes till December 3rd. It costs \$260. We can have up to 60 students.

- Accountability funds – As of last year, we have \$17,695.16. The county has not released our official rollover funds. We will not get any money from the state. Any extra funds will come from unclaimed Teacher Classroom funds. Mrs. Morst said there was a meeting with the School Board at the beginning of the year. New CFO said she does not believe in rollover dollars because the money is meant for students who are in the school at the time. In the past we have used this money for detentions or to fund PSD activities. The money must be spent to benefit the school.

- SESIR (School Environmental Safety Incident Reporting) – There were 12 incidents in the month of August. There was one physical attack. Donald DiCarlo questioned those stats. Ms. Stiverne says if students mutually fight each other, those stats do not count.
 - Old Business
 - New Business
 - SAC Bylaws approval/vote – Brooke Harter motioned to vote on the by-laws. Length of term for officers were voted to remain at one year.
 - Officer nominations process and vote - Mrs. Tortorella moved to change nominations to the end of the year, the last meeting of the year. This would be a change to Section 2. It was unanimously agreed to do this. Formal election of officers will be at the first meeting of the new year.
 - Composition Report – We need a non-instructional employee and an ELL parent. SAC membership must be a mirror of school demographics. We can be +20%.
 - School Wide Positive Behavior Plan presentation- Ms. Stiverne – Ms. Gibbs and sgt. Major Nevels have agreed to join the behavior committee. We have a student population of 3,052. We had 98 students with 2-5 referrals. Our discipline plan is considered effective. Disobedience/insubordination and class skipping were our two highest categories for discipline referrals. 126 of those incidents took place in the gym. Efforts such as the use of uniforms and stricter enforcement by staff have driven those numbers down this year. The Behavior Committee is exploring new initiatives to reward good behavior. Jag Bucks could be making a comeback. Our goal is to have referrals decrease by 15% this year. Ms. Stiverne believes we can meet that goal.
 - Nicole Morst was nominated as I-zone rep. Mrs. Brissett motioned. Danielle Tortorella seconded. She was unanimously re-elected.
 - Gifted rep – Mrs. Morst nominated Carla Figueroa. She was unanimously elected.
 - We are looking for an ESE parent and an ELL parent.
 - Adjournment -We are waiting on information for how to vote on the distribution of A+ funds. Fiorella De Camperos motioned to adjourn. Donald DiCarlo seconded.

- Establish a quorum and call to order at 3:17pm beginning meeting.
- Principal's report- Dr. Kaplan

Cut a significant amount of money and the new CFO needed to be educated on the funding of the high schools.

-22/1 is usual funding for high schools, and we were raised to 24 and then to 26 they were upping our numbers and we were unable to keep the budget, so the principals fought back and the situation was resolved and the money was given back to the schools and they were moved back to 22/1.

-We should be back up to an "A" when we get the testing reports

-What is the additional support to the auditorium? - \$40,000

-Auditorium news – the design is incredible – they are above 850-900 seats for the auditorium. Black box theater and big auditorium. Breaking ground August 2026 and should be finished Dec 2027 - Jan 2028 should be completed.

-VE class will be with certain teachers and have a specific support facilitator and an assistant for these students.

-Adding extra guidance counselors to the schools was discussed at the last board's meeting. What is happening with this? They are putting too many requirements on our counselors rather than them working with the students.

-Dual enrollment information- exceedingly difficult to find out from guidance and also from Broward College – one of the students made a template to define what to do and how to do it. She has been counseling students who are seeking out the information.

-We want one place for our students to get information for the AA degree and not have to scout around for the information.

-Projections for next year- 2600 kids, but we have 2850 in the system now

-All staff have been brought back

- PTSO and SAF report- Nicole Morst
Elections were moved to the fall – August - waiting for Journey to The Jungle- to get more volunteers.

Give backs this year – prom student, college tour, grad bash, homeless, teacher appreciation, student parking space, VPK signs, score at the top- scores improved,

Increased about 100 points; no free lunch next year, but there will be breakfast, you must apply for the free or reduced lunch; work with the school for an "Angle fund"- to pay for students who have a negative account so they don't get a cheese sandwich; start time for the schools will remain the same and middle school will add on 10 more min.; reproductive health is coming back to the schools- we adopted the curriculum from collier county.
