

- Call to Order and establish quorum - Meeting is beginning at 3:05pm. Quorum established.
- Approval of Minutes-Carla Figueroa (in compliance should be two words not one)
- Mrs. Figueroa's name was mis-spelled. Jennifer Fredricks should be one F.
- Aaron Hilaire needs to be added to the attendance.
- Roxanne Brissett - previous corrections to the previous meeting minutes need to be added. Carrie Forsyth motions to accept the minutes. Erika Luna seconds.
- Principal's Report-We are getting ready for Thanksgiving break. The football team went to the playoffs ... and lost in the first round unfortunately. Band performed very well (first in the state for percussion). Swimmers - four swimmers went to states for the 200m Relay, Ethan Persten made finals for the 400m freestyle. The team is ranked 15th in the Division 4A, the most competitive division in the state. Bianca Gibbs ranked 8th in the state. Drama students got Superior in Tech for their One Act. Newspaper team just returned from Nashville for a National convention. One of the boys in Cross Country ranked 3rd in the County.
- Chorus is preparing for Disney Candlelight.
- The school choice window has opened for next year. We are at 2800 students enrolled now.
- We are an A school from last year and will continue that this year.
- PTSO Report-Mrs. Tortorella says there is no report at the moment. The PTSO is taking banner orders. Brissett asked can clubs do banners? Yes they can.

- Procedural voting- reviewing procedures. A Quorum is a majority plus one. This is needed in order to vote. When making a motion and seconding, please say your name so the secretary can record it. The vote can be a roll call vote or a yay/nay vote.
- New Business
- Discussion of 26-27 Schedule options-Dr. Kaplan gave this presentation. The School Board has triggered a clause in the contract that allows them to amend the schedule for 2026-27 school year. There will be only one choice on the ballot. Teachers will have an option to vote yes or no. At the conclusion of this meeting, SAC must put forth a recommended ballot. If we do not have a ballot and no action is taken, our schedule will default to a straight 7 periods. The choice needs to be made by December 12th. Teachers would teach 6 out of 7, and there would be a total elimination of study hall.
 - The options are a straight 7 period day. You would see every class every day for 50 minutes a day.
 - The next option is a rotator 7 where one period would rotate out every day and only 6 periods would meet each day.
 - Modified A/B block-7 period block. In all versions of this there would be one or two classes you would see every day.
 - In one option the morning would be all short classes, the afternoon would be longer. The fourth option flips this and has longer morning periods and short afternoon periods.
 - Mr. Hilaire asked what problem is being solved by this. Dr. Kaplan said this would save the \$35 million for the District.
 - Mrs. Gebbia asked is there any schedule that would allow the teachers to keep the extra money. The answer was no, teachers would lose money in every schedule option.
 - Charlotte pointed out that students would lose opportunities to take dual enrollment periods. Dr. Kaplan emphasized that he is not doing anything, he's explaining the options.
 - Mrs. Schoen pointed out that prior to the block, teachers taught 5 out of 7 and you still had an option to teach extra classes. In the current model, teachers would be teaching one period for free and have an option to teach only one extra class. Dr. Kaplan said right now 170 extra periods are given out now. That would drop drastically. SOME extra periods could be given out, but no guarantee as to how many.
 - Mrs. Batchelor asked if graduation requirements would be affected. There don't seem to be any impacts.
 - Mr. DeLeeuw said that with a loss of study hall, students who need Edmentum or ESE time would lose that time that they currently have through study hall. Students in advanced classes who count on that study hall classes would lose that time. Is there any way we can abstain or protest from voting on anything? Dr. Kaplan said we could do that, but it would mean we would likely have a 7 period day forced upon us.
 - Donald DiCarlo asked "If we do nothing, we get a straight 7, but if we vote for a better option we could get that. Is there any way we could keep the schedule we have now?" Dr. Kaplan said the School Board would decide that ultimately based on what they hear from the public.
 - Mrs. Gebbia said if we choose a schedule, isn't that like saying we are choosing something we don't really want.
 - Mr. Beauchamp BTU Steward: "The Union disagrees with this process. This is a District initiative. First, the staff did vote to overwhelmingly support the current schedule. The Union has a concern with the language of the ballot. If this vote does not hit a 66 and 2/3s support for the new schedule. If the District imposes a choice, that would be actionable on the part of the union. Everyone who likes the current schedule is STRONGLY encouraged to voice their opinion directly to the School Board. Teachers face a \$6,000 to \$12,000 pay cut. Mr. Beauchamp says we need to come together to make our opinions known to the School Board. That's parents and students and teachers.
 - Dr. Kaplan says the District wants all high schools on the same schedule (i.e. 7 periods). Dr. Kaplan does not think there will be bait and switch to trick us into choosing a schedule other than the one we want.

- Mr. Beauchamp differed. He said the contract language could cause a problem because if we choose a different schedule, we could be locked in for at least two years, even if the District changes its mind after the fact.
- Mrs.
- Emmie Guzman asked what will happen if the District changes their mind. Dr. Kaplan said he thinks this whole process would be thrown out and we would start over.
- Mrs. Figueroa says the District is going to do whatever they want. If we don't action, we are going to default to the seven period schedule. She recommends we vote on what is best for teachers and students. Otherwise we will get stuck with something we do not want. Mrs. Figueroa wants to hear from students and teachers what they would see as the better option?
- Nicole Morst said there was a District Advisory Committee meeting. They advised that schools vote to keep their current schedules.
- Blen says we need to make the District understand that we do not want a different schedule. If forced to choose one, she prefers choice C1.
- Mrs. Schoen spoke in favor of Mr. Newman who reminded everyone that with the loss of study hall, students who face absenteeism will have even more of a hard time finding time to make up work.
- Fiorella asked if SAC puts out a ballot, will teachers know that if we don't make a choice, a 7 period schedule will be forced upon us? Mrs. Brissett said the SAC ballot can only have one option with a Yes/No choice. If no vote is successful before end of November, we would need a SAC Emergency Meeting on December 4th where we discuss the ballot only and create a new ballot with one option. Second faculty vote would be 12/10. If no choice is made then, we are out of time because the deadline is 12/12.
- Tammy Schoen says she prefers the schedule where first period remains the same and other periods rotate. The reason is because the morning announcements are shown in first period every day.
- Dr. Danielle Bradley doesn't care what she teachers when. We are being asked to teach 6 periods when we used to teach 5. In the new schedule we would be teaching classes for free. Dr. Bradley says she wants to be paid for the extra time she is teaching.
- Mrs. Batchelor wants to know why the District did not consider other options like reducing downtown staff? Why is this solution being placed on the backs of teachers and students? Mr. Beauchamp said the Union has suggested that. He says the District does not seem to be interested in considering that option. They are "looking at it". Mr. Beauchamp wanted to know why is there only one option on the ballot? Mrs. Brissett said the District said it has to be a yes/no option. Dr. Kaplan says it creates consensus between faculty and SAC.
- Mrs. Schoen: Have they done an analysis of what they would save by closing schools? Dr. Kaplan said there is definitely a financial crisis. But we don't have all the facts to be able to say that other options to address the crisis would work any better than the proposal we are currently considering. The District is definitely considering closing schools for next year or year after. District positions are being cut by attrition.
- Mike Gregory Chief Safety and Security Officer for the District said we have lost over 9,000 students in one year. Those students mean we have lost money over the last 10 years. (Over 30,000 students over those years). The District is in crisis and the current plan is to move KC Wright staff into schools. There are multiple tracks of savings that the District is pursuing.
- Mrs. Gabbia asked how much are we paying the old superintendents? No one could answer that question. She wanted it noted that we are voting under duress and we want our current schedule. She wants that noted in any answer on what we are voting for.
- Mrs. Lehrman asked what would this schedule mean for class sizes? Dr. Kaplan said he could not answer that until he sees a budget. Also, if teachers don't choose the option that SAC recommends, how would that affect choices in the future?
- Anum Khan said C1 and C2 are the best choices because they are closest to what we have now.
- Charlotte says that as someone who has extracurriculars and advanced schedules she will miss study hall.
- Emmie says C1 looks like the best choice. This is because it will be drastically different.
- Donald agrees that C1 is the best choice because he wants to preserve the Senior privilege. This

would be the best way to handle the stress of advanced classes and study time.

- Jake Harter says he supports C1
- Mrs. Figueroa supports the students and chooses C1
- Mrs. Daniels likes C2 because lunches are the same.
- Carole Brown asked how these schedules would affect testing.
- Mrs. Schoen said 106 minute classes would be very difficult for students to manage to pay attention.
- Mrs. Morst said this decision was presented in a closed door session. She recommends we email our frustration.
- Ms. Blaise asked if we went to C1, would all Seniors get 1st period Senior privilege? Dr. Kaplan said he can't answer that right now. Right now about 200 of 650 seniors have Senior Privilege.
- Mrs. Nussbaum asked if teachers could ask for which planning period they would want. Dr. Kaplan said most teachers would not want a planning because they would want the extra money.
- Mrs. Scott said if we went with C1 it would give Seniors fewer choices for electives. Dr. Kaplan said that is not true. In the FOCUS scheduling it allows schedulers to take students' requests into consideration.
- Officer Anderson said it depends on which period you want to shortchange. He chose to support C1.
- Donald DiCarlo motions to move C1 on the ballot.
- Charlotte Gebia seconds.
- Beth Ackerman took the roll call vote. 38 yeses. The motion passes to move C1 to the ballot and send it to the faculty. The faculty vote will be November 21st. We may need an emergency meeting on 12/4 if teachers reject the first ballot.
