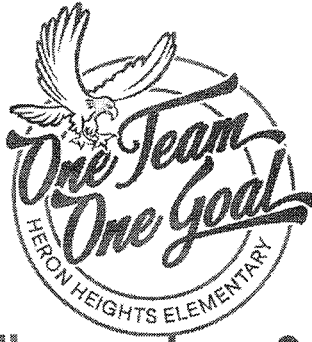

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







I.	Welcome: Mrs. Gibson
II.	Student Lighthouse Team – They did not present today.
III.	Literacy Plan – There is a committee for literacy. They help to make sure that instruction is flowing along, that interventions are being completed, push in and pull out of classrooms, co-teaching, modeling for teachers, etc. Students who are below level are assessed to figure out their weaknesses and where they need extra help. Evidence based instruction and curriculum is being used. Professional learning is provided for teachers. If a student is struggling in reading, there is an at home plan to assist with reading. Free books are sent to the home for these students.
IV.	HHE Aftercare – Registration has been difficult for the last two years due to the District. There aren't enough seats for all the students that want to come to aftercare. In the beginning, it's hard to plan due to many of our counselors being college students who don't have their schedules yet. The hiring has been challenging. A motion will go to SAF for the District to help us hire people.
V.	Attendance Update – There have been robocalls for absent and tardy students in the late afternoon. With elementary, parents should be notified earlier if a student is late or absent.
VI.	School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR): There was one report, minor disruption of campus. This is where a student disrupted one area of the school.
VII.	Accountability Funds Balance: \$3,418.64 There is a request to use these funds for Mr. Gibson to push into 5 th grade classes for science and 4 th grade for math. This would cost about \$1,000. The rest of the money would go into the sub funds so that teachers can go to professional development. Mrs. Gibson made a motion to use the funding for this purpose and it was approved.
VIII.	Principal's Update: McGreevy – 3/3 is the Third Annual Fifth Grade Science Night. This is a way for parents to find out more info about the science test. Students do a project during this time. Then the groups play Are You Smarter Than a Fifth Grader. 3/5 is Bingo Night – it will be outside this time and book fair will be open.

	<p>Last Friday we hosted a Community Leadership Day through Leader and Me. This went well, students led the tours and did a wonderful job. There will be action teams created for the schools so that there can be collaboration. There will also be a parent training. This would be a train the trainer where the parents and teachers go and then come back to train.</p> <p>3/16 – 3/20 – Spring Break 3/30 – iZone meeting will be held here 3/31 – 4th and 5th grade writing test</p> <p>There is a March Madness for iReady going on throughout the school. There is in-class remediation ongoing in science.</p>
IX.	<p>SAF Updates – The amount of testing was discussed. The State is looking at reducing the number of questions on FAST. Parents concerns were heard and the District is looking at how to reduce testing in some way.</p> <p>A link to the next meeting will be provided. The timing of attendance calls will be addressed, so that elementary schools get tardy calls later.</p>





