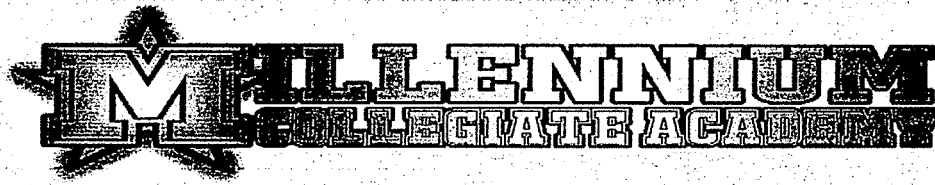

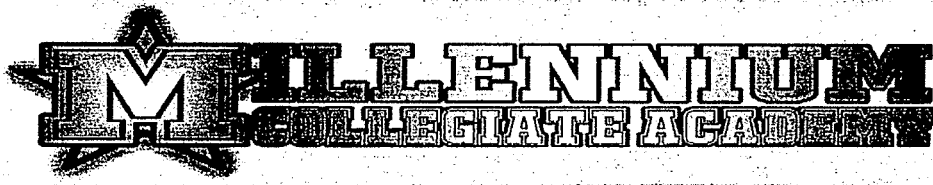

- **School ID:** Students must wear their school ID. They can wear last year's ID until they receive a new one.
- **Dress Code:** Students must be in uniform. They cannot wear black polo shirts. Refer to our unified dress code policy.
- **Wireless Communication Devices:** Wireless communication devices must be powered off or in airplane mode during the entire school day, including passing periods and lunchtime. From bell to bell, cell phones, laptops, headphones, smartwatches, and all other wireless devices must be turned off unless directed by a school employee for instructional purposes. Our A-rated district requires students to Disconnect to Reconnect and elevate learning in a distraction-free environment.
- **Important Reminders:**
 - Students are not to be dropped off on campus until 9:00 AM, as there is no adult supervision before this time.
 - Per District policy, students should not be picked up for early dismissal after 4 PM.
 - Please consistently discuss "See/Hear Something Say Something" with your child.
 - Encourage your children to use social media positively. It is not to be used to defame, embarrass, or bully their fellow students. These actions are far reaching and can cause emotional scars that never heal and police involvement.
- **Before & Afternoon School:** Please remind your child that once they are on campus in the morning, they cannot leave the school campus. In the afternoon, they cannot walk off campus with their friends and then try to return to campus. This is not allowed.
- **Reporting Incidents:** Please remind your child that if they know or are aware of planned fights or conflicts, they need to report them to their teachers, counselors, administrator, or security staff. Also, students will receive consequences if they are running toward or recording fights and incidents. Please review these expectations with your child.

**School Advisory Council (SAC) Meeting Minutes
February 25th, 2026**

1. Welcome and Pledge of Allegiance

- a. A meeting of Millennium 6-12 Collegiate Academy Advisory Council was held in the media center on January 21, 2026, at 6:07pm
 - i. Called to order—Mr. Byron Lee (Chair)
 - ii. Seconded by Ms. Edwards
- b. The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. Review and Acceptance of January 21st, 2026, SAC minutes.

- a. Attendees reviewed the minutes for the January 2026 meeting.
 - i. Motioned – Ms. Edwards
 - ii. Seconded – Mrs. Chin

3. Principal's Report—Dr. Harrigan

- i. Currently, we are awaiting the budget for the 2026-2027 school year and thereafter we can foresee our instructional needs. We lost 8 teachers due to budget cuts.
- ii. Title 1 Survey percentage goals were not met. Current threshold is 63.8%.
- iii. Currently in the course selection phase and parents may be presented with the course details so that parents are in the loop of students are choosing.

4. PSD Continuation Waiver Faculty Ballot

a. School Improvement Plan: Mid-year Reflection:

- i. ELA PM1 50%, PM2 55%, which is a 5% increase.
- ii. Math PM1 20%, PM2 30%, which is a 10% increase.
- iii. Science BOY 23%
- iv. Biology MOY 51%
- v. Civics PM1 BOY 50%, PM2 60%

b. During the 2022-2023 school year, the FLDOE reduced PSD from 8 days to 4 days.

c. Keep the waiver for the upcoming 2026 -2027 school year.

- i. 10 out of 11 constituents unanimously voted to keep for the next upcoming school year.
- ii. All content area data was shared with stakeholders, and each group engaged in meaningful discussion. Stakeholders had the opportunity to review the information and provide input. The ballot was presented through the PowerPoint and approved following collective review.
- iii. First motion to approve: Ms. Chin and Second Motion: Ms. Edwards. Overall, SAC voted to approved ballot unanimously.

This year our faculty will need to vote on the Continuation Professional Study Day Waiver for the next school year. On Wednesday, March 4th, we will have a Faculty Meeting at 9:00 a.m. in the Media Center, to discuss the Waiver process.

Following the PSD presentation, faculty members will cast their vote to determine whether we will continue the PSD Waiver for next school year.

In addition to the six early release days currently scheduled, students at Millennium 6-12 Collegiate Academy will be dismissed three hours early for four additional days during the 2026-2027 school year for the purpose of High School Reform.

_____ I am in favor of the Professional Study Days Waiver for the 2026-2027 school year.

_____ I am NOT in favor of the Professional Study Days Waiver for the 2026-2027 school year.

According to BTU Contract Article 15, at least 80% of the faculty must vote and 67% of those that voted must vote for approval of the ballot.

Should fewer than 80% of the faculty vote, then the vote will not count and the waiver will end. If 80% do vote but less than 67% vote for approval, then the waiver will not pass and we will not continue the PSD waiver.

Please note that this email serves as your 3-day notification of vote.

Just to reiterate, in order for the waiver to pass/continue into next school year, 66.67% of eligible voters must vote "yes" to approve waiver request. Should the waiver not pass with the needed 66.67%, we will not continue to have PSD for the next school year (2026-2027).



